High School students inspired by mining

Twenty-eight students from Collie Senior High School recently experienced what a career in the mining industry at Premier Coal would be like as part of the Work Inspiration Reach Out program run by The Smith Family.

As part of the program, the Year Nine students participate in a two-day schedule where they visit workplaces to gain an insight into employment, connect with a business and explore a career pathway with that employer.
